- **Vergina (Aigai)** – The ancient capital of the Macedonian kingdom and burial site of Philip II, father of Alexander the Great. The recently opened Archaeological Museum of Aigai is considered one of the most impressive museums in Greece, featuring the royal tombs and priceless treasures that illuminate the grandeur of the Macedonian dynasty.
- **Kir-Yianni Winery in Naoussa** – One of Greece's most renowned wineries, situated on the slopes of Mount Vermion. Participants will enjoy a guided tour of the vineyards and wine cellars, followed by a curated wine-tasting session and a traditional Macedonian lunch at the winery's restaurant.
